

DEVELOPMENT OF A LOCAL HEPA POLICY ANALYSIS TOOL IN FRANCE

CAPLA – SANTÉ

Cadre d'Analyse des Politiques Locales Activité physique-Santé

The promotion of Health-Enhancing Physical-Activity (HEPA) became a major public health issue at international, national and local levels. To develop effective HEPA policies at the local level, policymakers need to take into account a territorial context embedded in complex systems. Therefore, based on the World Health Organization's HEPA Policy Audit Tool (HEPA PAT), a local HEPA policy analysis tool was designed to support local governments to build their policies.

CAPLA-SANTÉ was built for local actors to be:

- A decision support tool and advocacy support in the development and implementation of HEPA policies,
- A catalyst for improving intersectoral work on local policy making,
- An overview of HEPA policies that facilitates the identification of these at the sub-national level.

Access to the tool

An intersectoral group of experts was established, and four workshops were organized to adapt and to design the local HEPA policy analysis tool. The first draft of the tool has been collected from practitioners and decision-makers in the testing phase in twelve local governments in France. A final workshop has been dedicated to considering stakeholders' feedback and reach consensus in the group of experts on the final version of the tool. This tool is now largely disseminated in subnational territories in France for HEPA capacity-building.
